SpVJSA Competitive Policies & Procedures

Team Formation Deadlines

- A. In order to allow players the opportunity to attend all tryouts they desire, teams cannot officially be formed until after all tryouts are completed for the team's age group and level.
- This shall be the first date upon which a player may be asked to officially join a team, complete a registration form, or pay fees.
 - Teams shall not request, coerce, or require any player to commit to any team or club prior to this date.
 - Teams may notify players that they have been "selected" prior to this date, but must wait for any player's commitment until after this date.
- B. Teams must be properly registered within 14 days of the packet pick up date.
- Team packet pick up is 3 days after the last tryout. Tryout rosters must be submitted before packets can be picked up.
 - To be properly registered a team must submit a team information form listing all team officials, SpVJSA registration forms (12 player minimum), and SpVJSA roster sheet.
 - After this date all players not on a team roster (i.e., SpVJSA form submitted and specific team and coach designated) who attended tryouts are considered not selected. These players are released from any obligation by all teams and cannot be held in reserve in any manner. No money or registration forms can be held for these players.
 - A tryout list of players not selected will be sent out 2 days after the packet turn in/due date.

WSYSA Code of Ethics: Rule 608.2, Article V Responsibilities Regarding Scouting and Recruiting

- All WSYSA rules pertaining to recruiting shall be strictly observed by coach, manager or any team representative.
- It is inappropriate to recruit player(s) actively playing for another team.
- It is unethical for a player to be recruited or enticed from the Olympic Development Program (ODP) setting, either by his ODP coach or any other coach, manager, player, parent or team representative.
- When discussing the advantages of his/her organization, the coach has an obligation to be forthright and refrain from making derogatory remarks regarding other coaches, teams and organizations.
- It is unethical for any coach to make a statement to a prospective athlete which cannot be fulfilled, illegal to promise any kind of compensation or inducement for play, and immoral to deliver same.
- Coaches shall not scout any team, by any means whatsoever, except in regularly scheduled games.

Responsibility to Officials and Zero Tolerance to Referee Abuse

- Officials must have the support of coaches, players, and spectators. Coaches must always refrain from criticizing officials in the presence of players or spectators.
- Professional respect before, during, and after the game, should be mutual. There should be no demeaning dialogue or gestures between official, coach, spectator, or player.
- Coaches must not incite players or spectators or attempt to disrupt the flow of the game.
- Comments regarding an official should be made in writing to the association.
- SpVJSA abides by a Zero Tolerance for referee abuse. Coaches are responsible for the behavior of their players and the spectators on their team's sideline. The coach may be warned by the referee due to the conduct from his/her sideline. If abuse continues, the referee has the obligation to eject the coach as punishment for the continuing abuse.
- The referees have the authority to remove any player, coach, or spectator from the facility.
